Privacy Policy



10 July 2017

The Aotearoa Catholic Youth Festival (**Festival**) is a national gathering of Catholic young people organised and conducted by the New Zealand Catholic Bishops Conference's Council for Young People (**Council**).

The Council is committed to protecting the privacy of individuals who provide personal information to it, including those who provide personal information to it via its website, registration system, and social media properties.

The Council is committed to complying with the NZ Privacy Act 1993 and all applicable principles governing the handling of personal information. This Privacy Policy is designed to tell you about the Council's practices in relation to the collection, use, disclosure and storage of personal information in relation to the Festival

What is personal information?

Personal information is any information about you that identifies you or from which your identity reasonably can be determined.

What types of personal information does the Council collect?

The Council collects and holds personal information that includes (but is not limited to):

- your name, address, telephone number, facsimile number, email address and other contact details;
- date of birth, gender, marital status and occupation;
- financial information, such as donation history and credit card details, for instance, when you register for a ticket to the festival;
- identification documents, including driver's license, passport or proof of age card; and
- photographs, videos and news stories in respect of the Festival or Catholic Church related events and activities; and
- information about your dietary requirements, special needs and disabled access requirements (if any).

Why does the Council collect personal information?

The Council collects and holds personal information for various reasons (which we generally notify to you at the time of collection), including the following primary purposes:

- to register your attendance at the Festival;
- to enable you to participate in offers, competitions, promotions, and events in relation to the Festival;

- to receive offerings and donations from you;
- to place your contact details on mailing lists and in computer databases in order to provide you with information about Catholic Church related activities, functions, issues and initiatives;
- to enable the Council to provide services in respect of the Festival, including catering; and
- to promote the Festival and related events.

How does the Council collect personal information?

The Festival's usual practice is to collect personal information directly from you either via the festival website or by some other method (such as by post or email). For example, some areas of the website or social media properties or registration system may require you to submit information to enable you to benefit from the special features (such as newsletters and brochures) or to participate in a particular activity (such as an offer, competition or promotion).

In addition to collecting personal information from you, sometimes the Council collects personal information from a third party if it is unreasonable or impracticable to collect the information from you directly, for example, where the information is provided to the Council from schools or parishes (for instance, registrations completed by a school on behalf of its students).

Does the Council collect information via passive information collection?

The Council may use cookies to assign your computer a User ID so that we can identify your computer on our server. You may configure your web browser so that you are notified in advance so your internet browser will disable cookies. In some instances cookies may collect and store personal information about you. Any personal information collected via the use of cookies will only be used by us in accordance with this Privacy Policy.

Your Consent

In most cases, The Council requires you to consent specifically to any collection, use or disclosure of your personal information by the Council. Your consent may be explicit, such as in writing or verbally, or may be implied by conduct.

If you are under the age of 18 years:

- you must have your parent/guardian's consent before you provide us with your personal information; and
- references to "consent" throughout this document includes consent provided by your parent/guardian.

By using the website, social media property, or registration system you agree to be bound by this Privacy Policy. Whenever you submit personal information to the Council, you consent to:

- (i) the collection, use, disclosure and storage of that information in accordance with this Privacy Policy;
- (ii) your personal information being used to improve the communication processes of the Council; and
- (iii) the receipt of emails or other communications about the Council and our activities (including information about marketing, promotional, and research

purposes), along with communications about Catholic-Church-related activities, functions, issues and initiatives from time-to-time.

In addition, if you provide personal information to the Council via any method, you agree that we may combine such information with other actively collected information unless we specify otherwise at the point of collection. We will take reasonable measures to prevent personal information from being combined with passively collected information, unless you consent otherwise.

How will the Council use the personal information you provide?

In general terms, the Council uses and discloses the personal information you provide for the specific purpose or purposes for which you have given consent and for secondary purposes for which you reasonably expect the Council to use or disclose your personal information.

For instance, if you have consented to receiving information about Catholic Church related activities, functions, issues and initiatives, the Council will send you email updates or newsletters regarding such Catholic Church matters.

Please be aware that you are free to “unsubscribe” to any publication that you receive from the Council at any time.

Does the Council disclose personal information to anyone?

The Council may disclose your personal information in a number of circumstances, for instance:

- (i) where you have provided your personal information for registration, you may have consented to the Council disclosing your personal information to the Festival Organisers (including employees and volunteers of Catholic Dioceses in New Zealand) for the purpose of enabling your participation at the Festival and the Council’s organisation of the Festival;
- (ii) in respect of the registrations, to third party providers of transactional and related services;
- (iii) where you have consented to us doing so (by way of example, in providing us with your contact details, you may have consented to the Council providing those details to another group, such as the New Zealand Catholic Bishops Conference or a Catholic Diocese in New Zealand);
- (iv) to consultants, advisers or other third parties where that party has been contracted to provide administrative or other services to the Council (and on the basis that that third party agrees to abide by this Privacy Policy); or
- (v) where required or authorised by law (for instance, in response to a court order).

Management and security of personal information

The Council takes all reasonable precautions to safeguard your personal information from loss, misuse, interference, unauthorised access, modification or unlawful disclosure.

However, you should keep in mind that the transmission of information over the internet is not completely secure or error-free. In particular, e-mail sent to or from this Site may not be secure, and you should therefore take special care in deciding what information you send to us via e-mail.

Access to personal information

You may request access to personal information that the Council holds about you or you can ask us to correct, amend or delete any personal information being held by the Council about you (see the

Council's contact details below).

The Council will take reasonable steps to update or correct, as soon as possible, any information in our possession that you have previously submitted that is inaccurate, incomplete, out-of-date, irrelevant or misleading.
